Josh Weaver June 17, 1982-September 9, 2009

This is the first time I have written about my son. It is Josh's 15-year Angelversary. My son's name is Alan Joshua Weaver. He died of a cocaine/morphine accidental overdose. I did not answer the phone the night before he died. I had brought work home and had a deadline. He died on Wednesday. I had gone to his house on Sunday before and went into his room at his roommate's house. I yelled at him to get up! His girlfriend had broken up with him. I told him he needed to find another job and pay for his car insurance. What was wrong with me, I still and always will feel guilty!! He wanted to come live with me and my second husband. I told him to come and have dinner and talk to us.



I wish I had told him to just come live with us. The night before he died my ex-husband's nephew gave him crack to smoke for the first time, then he did some cocaine and then this girl gave him morphine! I guess he wanted to sleep. His friends said he was clean for a month, so I don't know if Josh did the same amount of drugs he had done before and that's what killed him? Josh called his cousin and was unable to speak. Brad (cousin) told me Josh was slurring his words, so Brad hung up instead of calling for help! On Wednesday I kept calling Josh to see what he wanted me to bring him to eat but there was no answer. So, I got some crackers and soup and started driving to his house. It seemed like it took me forever to get there, but in reality, it was only 10 minutes from my office. When I arrived, there were police, an ambulance, and a fire truck. I stopped my truck, and I believe I left it running and started screaming, "are you coming for Josh?"

The police asked if he was a diabetic, I said he could be because my Josh was 300 lbs. and 6'4". They carried him out not intubated so I thought he was ok! They put me in the ambulance and started doing compressions on my son. All I can remember is me screaming!! They took the long way to the hospital, I can remember screaming, "why are we going this way." We got to the hospital, and they continued working on my Josh! I'm a billing manager for many anesthesia doctors at Potomac Hospital and the president came immediately to the hospital to support me.

Josh was pronounced and the detectives told me not to touch him. They were conducting an investigation and autopsy. I should have touched him all over!!! My mistake! Why did I listen to them?

I did not realize Josh had such a disease. Josh had depression and I later found out he had anxiety. I thought Josh smoked marijuana and may have done cocaine once in a while and I later found out he also did opiates.

Josh was a happy lil guy who played soccer and baseball. I was a team mom and loved it! Josh started to gain weight. He played freshman football, but his coach called him a fat boy and used 4 letter words. All the other parents voiced their objections too! They wanted Josh to play football in his sophomore year, but Josh would not!! He was done with that coach! So, you have the smart kids, the jocks and then you fit in where you can find friends. Josh was an artist, and I have his artwork hanging all over my house. He loved music and to rap and he would write poetry all the time.

His beard was impeccable, always perfectly trimmed. His head was shaved because he was starting to lose hair! He always had to have his clothes perfect even though he wore a 3XL or larger to hide his size. Josh was sweet, jolly, humble and he had a great smile. He was a good kid!

He loved my mashed potatoes and coming for all holidays or whatever dinners! He was always calling his sister Katie asking her what mom had in the fridge. He had quite a sense of humor and his laughter was contagious! He wore size 14 shoes, and he was my big teddy bear! His big hugs I miss the most! He used to say "MA...I LOVE YOU!" I miss that!! I love him more than my life itself. I will forever miss him!

Garden News

Hello Everyone,

We made it through the hot summer and very little rain. The garden looks beautiful. I want to thank everyone that helped to keep it that way by watering and weeding. Without the consistent watering that was done, everything would have been dried up. This also shows the love and care for our children. Next year we will need to do the same thing but hopefully it won't be the consistent 90+ degrees we had this summer. If anyone that didn't get to help this year wants to next year, please contact me or Jodi. We will be starting work again in early Spring. Right now, though, we still need to continue watering so we can still enjoy its beauty while things are still blooming and growing.

Come early Spring the Butterfly Bushes will need to be cut back, the grasses cut all the way down, trimming on other bushes, and leftover weeds pulled. We need to deadhead some things once we know they are the survivors when they begin to sprout and pull the non survivors, plant new plants and mulch. We need to prepare the garden for the Butterfly Release and just to enjoy throughout the seasons.

We are going to plan on the Butterfly Release for Sunday, June 29 for next year. Hopefully, it won't be as hot and more flowers will be in bloom.
